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Department of Revenue introduces new tools to help taxpayers when disaster strikes

St. Paul, Minn. – As summer storm season arrives, the Minnesota Department of Revenue is introducing new tools aimed at helping taxpayers before and after disaster strikes. The department has added a page to their website that includes FAQs, state and federal tax resources, and information on how to prepare for a disaster. Taxpayers can also sign up for the department’s Disaster Relief Notification list to receive email notifications.

“When a disaster strikes, filing and paying taxes often takes a backseat to clean-up efforts and rebuilding,” noted Revenue Commissioner Myron Frans. “We wanted to give taxpayers a resource they can go to before and after a disaster that will provide them with helpful, timely tax information when a disaster is declared.”

The department will still communicate with the public through the media as well as answering questions in taxpayer contact centers.
