Subp. 3. Expiration. A temporary license under subpart 1 or 2 expires on the second
June 30 after issuance, or after the license holder obtains a permanent license, whichever
occurs first. An applicant may not obtain more than one temporary license in the applicant's
lifetime. The four-year five-year time period during which temporary license holders must
obtain accredited Minnesota assessor (AMA) licensure under Minnesota Statutes, section
270C.9901, begins on the date the temporary license is issued.
