



Minnesota Working Family Credit

You may qualify for a state tax credit!

More income earned on your reservation now counts when calculating the Minnesota Working Family Credit.

What is the Working Family Credit?

It is a refundable credit for working individuals whose income is below a certain level. This credit is Minnesota's counterpart to the federal Earned Income Tax Credit. For 2020, the maximum Working Family Credit is:

- \$284 for taxpayers with no children
- \$1,136 for families with one qualifying child
- \$2,191 for families with two qualifying children
- \$2,541 for families with three or more qualifying children

If you are a tribal member who lives and works on your reservation, you can receive the credit even if Minnesota does not tax you.

What has changed?

The income limit to qualify for the credit was increased to allow more taxpayers to claim the credit.

How can the Working Family Credit benefit me?

It can reduce your Minnesota tax and may provide you a refund even if you do not owe tax.

Do I qualify for the Working Family Credit?

To qualify, you must file a 2020 Minnesota Income Tax return, qualify for the federal Earned Income Tax Credit, and be a full-year or part-year Minnesota resident. Also, your income from 2020 must be less than the following:

Number of Qualifying Children	Married Filing Joint	Any Other Filing Status
0	\$29,100	\$23,100
1	\$48,100	\$42,200
2	\$54,300	\$48,400
3 or more	\$58,000	\$52,000

Example. Daryl and Theresa are tribal members who live on the reservation where they are enrolled members. They are married, have two qualifying children, and earn \$30,000 in combined wages working on the reservation. Prior to 2017, Daryl and Theresa would not receive a Working Family Credit. Under the new law, they would qualify for a \$2,191 credit if they file a Minnesota return jointly. Since the Working Family Credit is a refundable credit, they would receive a \$2,191 Minnesota tax refund.
