Will Revenue add collection costs?

Revenue adds a collection cost of up to 25 percent to the balance. You may request cancellation of the collection cost as provided by Minnesota Statutes Section 16D.11, subdivision 3. Interest bearing debts will accrue interest in accordance with Minnesota Statutes Section 16D.13.

What actions can Revenue take?

Revenue is authorized by state law to take the following actions to collect this debt from you:

- File liens against property.
- Issue levies against assets, such as wages and bank accounts.
- Offset eligible:
 - Minnesota and Wisconsin state tax refunds
 - Minnesota payments and federal non-tax payments
 - Lottery winnings
- Subpoena financial, personal, and business records.
- Revoke or deny renewal or transfer of business and professional licenses.
- Access non-public government data.
- Obtain legal judgments against debtors.
- Report to a credit bureau.
- Refer debt to private collection agencies.
