Application & Fee

 Once all of the above requirements are completed, submit SAMA application and pay the application fee on the <u>Assessors Licensing System</u>.

Note:

- Assessors who move from one license level to another within the same fiscal year need only pay the fee difference between the two levels.
- o The Board does not act on applications until **ALL** requirements have been met.

• <u>Timeline Policy</u>: Applications for SAMA license and fees must be received no later than three business days prior to a board meeting.
