Analysis of H.F. 4663 (Gillman) / S.F 4926 (Gruenhagen)

The bill authorizes the city of Glencoe, if approved by the voters at a general election, to impose a sales and use tax of up to 0.5%.

The proceeds would be used to finance the following projects, plus associated bonding costs.

1. \$190,000 for maintenance, upgrades and improvements for Oak Leaf Park;
2. \$260,000 for maintenance, upgrades and improvements for Lincoln Park;
3. \$225,000 for maintenance, upgrades and improvements for Glenn Knoll Park;
4. \$350,000 for maintenance, upgrades and improvements for Railroad Depot Park;
5. \$1,700,000 for improvement to the city trail network.

The bill also authorizes the city to issue up to \$2.725 million worth of bonds, plus bond issuance costs.

The tax would terminate at the earlier of 15 years after the tax is first imposed or after the city council determines that the amount received from the tax is sufficient to pay for the costs of the projects listed above plus bond issuance costs and interest. The tax could expire earlier if the city so determines by ordinance.

The bill would have no direct impact on state taxes.
